Advanced Shoulder Update
May 1-2, 2010 – Columbus, OH

Course Description:

This 1½ day program is designed to bridge the gap between scientific research and clinical practice. The concepts and principles presented will emphasize current and innovative approaches to the biomechanical evaluation and treatment of shoulder pathology. Teaching methods will include lecture (50%) and lab practice (50%). The focus of the program is on immediate clinical application of evidence-based practice in a limited access environment.

Target Audience: PT, PTA, OT, COTA, ATC, SPT, SOT

Instructional Level: Intermediate to Advanced

Course Objectives

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:

1. explain and integrate the functional anatomy of the SC, AC, GH, and scapulothoracic joints into a plan of care on behalf of a patient
2. explain the functional and stabilizing function of the muscles and ligaments of the shoulder
3. define the biomechanical and EMG relationships of the upper extremity during functional activities
4. have an in-depth understanding of adhesive capsulitis, impingement syndrome, and labral lesions
5. perform a comprehensive and efficient orthopedic clinical examination of the shoulder based on current diagnostic evidence
6. understand the specificity, sensitivity and likelihood ratios for common special tests used in daily practice
7. name the common signs and symptoms of operative and non-operative pathologies of the shoulder
8. explain the evidence based rationale and general treatment concepts of orthopedic shoulder pathologies so as to design and implement specific therapeutic activities
9. perform manual and therapeutic exercise techniques for the shoulder
10. construct and implement a functional rehabilitation program with accurate dosage in the treatment of shoulder injuries

Ryan Perry, PT, DPT, OCS, MTC, CSCS, FAAOMPT graduated from Bradley University in 2001 with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy. He then attained his Certified Strengthening and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) in 2002. In 2004 Ryan completed his Manual Therapy Certification (MTC) through the Ola Grimsby Institute. Ryan proceeded to complete an orthopedic residency in 2005 through the Ola Grimsby Institute, which led to his Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) in 2006. Ryan completed the Fellowship Program in 2006, also through the Ola Grimsby Institute, which led to him being distinguished as a Fellow of the American Academy of Orthopedic Manual Physical Therapists (FAAOMPT).

Ryan has been very active with continuing education with an emphasis on manual therapy. He has been active in the HealthSouth/ NovaCare national journal club both as a member and moderator. Ryan has been a Site Coordinator / Center Manager since 2004. He also is the head of the Chicagoland Continuing Education Team and serves as a member of the National Clinical Career Ladder Advisory Panel. Finally, he is happily married to his beautiful wife, Stacy.
